### Global Educ8tions Plagiarism Declaration & Authenticity Policy

The policy on Plagiarism and every candidate should adhere to it when attending all training courses.

Plagiarism means using the work of others in preparing an assignment and presenting it as your own without acknowledging or referring where it came from. It is the presentation of another person's thoughts, opinions, ideas or words as though they were your own

When enrolled on a course, candidates are expected to produce original work.

The following practices are prohibited:

- Copying word for word directly from a text or other source without declaring the source.
- Using text from the Internet without declaring the source.
- Using diagrams produced by others without declaring the source.
- Copying from essays, notes and exercises of a fellow candidate, from the current or previous courses.
- Preparing a piece of work with others, and then claiming it to be your own.
- Allowing someone to copy your work, which they then present as being their own.

Submitting work that has been completed as part of group work or collaboration is acceptable when,

- You claim only the work you put into the session
- You use your own wording and explain your understanding of other people's input.

If you suspect any fellow candidates of cheating or plagiarism, you should report the incident to your tutor.
